Message from the Principal Mrs. Monica Davis

Dear benefactors,

"Amorevolezza" or Loving Care, a concept that was continuously espoused by St. Frances Cabrini in writings to her sisters, is our theme for the 2022-23 school year. St. Frances Cabrini wrote in her 'Travels,' "My Jesus, I have not always recognized your loving plans for me. But every day, with the help of your light, I learn more of your loving care." As a school, we hope to teach students and families of our Savior's loving care and to show them by example how we are loved by our heavenly Father.

We know that students can't learn unless they are in a safe, comfortable environment. After the social isolation of Covid-19 shutdowns, we have much to regain by being together again. Our school has worked hard to be a place where students can feel comfortable. Thanks to our fund-a-need at the auction, we have completed the renovation of our school kitchen so that we can be licensed by the health department to provide hot lunches again. The Annual Giving Campaign paid for a new carpet which is on its way to make the entrance of the school warm and inviting. Through government funding, our technology has been completely updated with fast cabling and access points to make high-speed internet available in all classes. We have created and furnished a second full-day Pre-K, with new and exciting centers to broaden the students' experiences, allowing parents a safe, loving classroom for these young children. We received an Early Learning grant from the Fulcrum Foundation to pay for the fence surrounding the big toys on the playground. The Fulcrum Foundation assisted us with money to paint the trim on the school, matching the rest of the campus, making for a bright, shiny exterior. Fulcrum Foundation funds also paid for a new H-VAC units for the Pre-K, Art, and Extended Care building. Finally, we launched a new website with a new logo, making our website more accessible to interested families. Be sure to check it out!

So much of this could only be done through the generous donations of our benefactors. Thank you for all you have done for the school and for the donations that you are able to continue to give to this worthwhile cause!

This year we have 70 students who could not attend our school without Tuition Assistance. Annual Giving funds make it possible for these students to receive the Catholic School education that is so important to them and their families. The strong Catholic Identity of the school provides a solid foundation in the Catholic Faith so that these children can continue evangelizing the world with the Christ's message for years to come.

Mother Cabrini wrote, "Love, today, must not be hidden, it must be active, vibrant, and true." Please make your love active, vibrant, and true by giving to the Annual Giving Campaign, allowing our students to be strong Christians who go out into the world showing love to their neighbors.

David Vanderwall – Class of 2012

I was tremendously humbled by the invitation to write this piece, but nevertheless found difficulty in doing justice to a place which has been perhaps the most formative part of my life. It has been the greatest of privileges to find myself on the other side of the country pursuing an MD-PhD at Harvard Medical School, but in my personal reflection, is a direct consequence of all the support I have been given over the years that helped me get here. People have ceaselessly extended their congratulations to me, more people than I realized I had any sort of connection with; while their words of affirmation and support have been deeply impactful for me, it fails to recognize how this journey has been shaped by the incredibly supportive and inspiring people who have guided me along the way. And that story really began at St. Frances Cabrini.

Though I graduated from SFC exactly ten years ago, in many ways, it feels like just yesterday I was a pre-Kindergarten student learning at the warm hands and devoted love of Ms. Delgado in a school that I did not yet know but would come to hold fondly in my heart for my entire life. Ms. Lyon's 3rd grade Class Zoo remains firmly planted in my mind. Hours spent in play at Extended Care with Ms. Summers and Mrs. Lunsford are some of the fondest memories I have from my time at SFC. But truly I can say my love of God and love of learning were ignited by the inspiring faculty and devoted men of Christ who so passionately served the school I grew up in. -

I can see clearly now looking back how God's hands were working early on in my life; it was truly a privilege to be able to attend SFC. It was by no means a guarantee for my family, and while I remember being a sweaty Cabrini Weenie in a red sweater vest at one time in my life, everything I am today is a consequence of the values and traditions instilled by this school and my family. It was not without the hard work and sacrifices of my father Bob Vanderwall, and the Christ-like conviction of my mother Candy Vanderwall, who gave this opportunity to me. But what did Cabrini give me which so profoundly molded my life?

Science and medicine never truly interested me when I was a kid; I found myself quite concerned with kickball and PE. However, things changed quite a bit in 6th grade when my mother was diagnosed with cancer. For those of you who knew her or had the chance to meet her, you are well aware that she carried with her the divine grace of a saint. Her devotion not only to the parish, but to all the students of SFC was not only commendable, but quite demonstrative of the selfless heart she enriched our great school with. I am convinced her spirit continues to breathe amidst the hallways, corridors, and depths of the school and church today.

To watch such a profound and vibrant woman brought to such a painful condition affected me in ways I still have not been able to reckon with, but I knew then that God had called me to a vocation that transcended my personal ambitions. No person deserves to suffer such chronic illness in utter desperation, let alone at the age of forty-eight, hopeless and afraid. It has been difficult to come to terms with the fact that no amount of work I put in will ever bring her back, as much as I would like that to be the case. But I have found no better way to memorialize the most profound woman I ever had the privilege to love and be loved by, than by extending that love to the patients I hope to serve and the community that raised me.

The priests and deacons throughout my years at Cabrini showed me that the Tradition we carry in this Body is sufficient evidence that man truly does not live on bread alone. I spent the last three years working at St. Jude Children's Hospital, and what I learned while working there is that, while it takes the measured wit of physicians and meticulous minds of scientists that bring about transformative therapies for the kids we treated, these cures also do not come about without the miracles do not happen without the hand of God.

Cabrini did not just deliver on its promise to instill the values we Catholics bear upon our hearts but ignited a fire in my mind. Convicted by Mr. Madden's 6th-grade science class and my newfound mission in the field of oncology, I came to learn that science is not just a subject which is learned in school, in the dense words of a heavy, hardcover textbook. It is the manner by which we approach the world around us. He showed me that we can observe the beauty surrounding us and ask ourselves: what is the nature of this flower and how did it come to be? How can biology at the same time create such tremendous awe, apparent uniformity, and pattern within each petal, yet at the same time each one is different from the last? How can it be that they share the same shapes, their petals form the same pattern and indulge in the same nutrients, and though they die, every Spring they rise again? I came to find science is the brush with which God paints his creation with.

So, to the current students of St. Frances Cabrini, I would like to leave you with this: Do not be deterred by the beauty you find yourself surrounded with. We often look away from things which are beautiful because they highlight our glaring imperfections; even Moses turned away from the burning bush, blinded by its perfection. Embrace that feeling of smallness. The Book of Isaiah states that "God keeps in perfect peace those whose minds are steadfast because they trust in Him." Lean into that trust and be attentive to the beauty that He reveals to you; you may find it in the strangest of places. I happened to find that beauty in the deepest suffering of my life because He showed me. If you look closely enough, you may find it too. If you listen closely to the breath of His Spirit in the world around you, be prepared for a life of fulfillment that will take you places you never thought possible. Go on to use that grace and invest every ounce that He grants you in the service of those around you; I promise to you that doing so will fill your life with such tremendous love and joy that you will weather any storm which comes your way. And don't forget to pray.
